

Presently, the Honor Committee is not required to release statistics on preceding cases. The proposed amendment to the constitution would require the Committee to release statistics every year for the preceding five years on the cases, hearings, and outcomes the committee has come to. These statistics will be aggregated and completely anonymous.

Presently, Article III section 3 of the Honor Code states that under normal circumstances any violation of the Honor System will result in a penalty of one-year suspension. The proposed new section 3 would require the committee to assess a punishment of academic probation and a recommendation of a 0 on the exam, for most cases of students writing over time. However, in egregious cases the Committee would assess a penalty of one-year suspension.

The last amendment changes the language in what would be section 4 of the constitution to state that in all other cases not covered by Section 3 of the constitution, the Committee shall maintain the standard penalty of one-year suspension.
